

Physical Education and School Sport at The Oaklands Primary School.

Vision.

All children at The Oakland's will have an enjoyable and positive experience of PE and school sport where effort, sportsmanship, teamwork and excellence will be encouraged and celebrated. This will be underpinned by high quality teaching; access to a broad range of sports (alternative/traditional) provided by a range of providers in which children can chose to participate recreationally or competitively as part of the 'Sainsbury School Sport Games.'

For those children who would like further sporting experiences to participating opportunities will be provided to spectate, lead, officiate and to report on sport.

On entering the next stage of their physical education experience at secondary school, Oakland's children will be physically literate, understand how to make healthy lifestyle decisions and most importantly have positive attitudes towards physical activity to embrace further sporting opportunities provided.

Sports Premium 2016/2017

The sports premium is made available to primary schools to *support and develop the provision of PE* in primary schools until 2020.

Funding for the academic year 2016/2017 was **£9500**.

Sports Premium 2017/2018

The premium was doubled for the 2017/2018 academic year.

Funding for the academic year 2017/2018 is **£19350**.

Section B- Physical Education and School Sport Action Plan 2017/2018

The action plan identifies our priority areas for development in 2017/2018 and provides details of how our sports premium funding will be spent and the intended impact we expect it to have on further developing our sporting provision.

The action plan (and use of the sports premium) is divided into the following areas:

- 1) Promote high quality teaching of PE by all teachers.
- 2) a-Develop curriculum provision.
b-Develop extra curriculum provision.
- 3) Participation and success in competitive sport
- 4) Partnership work on PE with local schools and clubs.
- 5) Links with other subjects.
- 6) Making healthy lifestyle decisions.

Please note: the sports premium funding devoted to these areas are approximate and may change throughout the year as priorities /impacts are assessed and amended according to need.

As at 01/08/17- allocated funding is £7,750 (does not include possible funding requirements [trips, initiatives etc])

Sustainability.

Sports premium funding is not guaranteed beyond 2020. Therefore our current use of the funding must ensure developments to the provision of PE are self-sustaining. To achieve this we have:

- Allocated a large percentage of sports premium funding to class teachers working alongside specialist coaches in order to up-skill them.
- Staff will be competent and confident in teaching a range of physical activities that will maintain participation rates, lead to high standards and success in competitive sports and provide a broad and balanced curriculum that is fully inclusive.
- All class teachers are required to complete learning journals for any support they receive identifying the impact it will have on their own teaching.

- Positive working relationships have been developed with a range of external providers which will hopefully continue beyond school sport premium being withdrawn.
- Provided opportunities for children to develop positive attitudes towards physical education and school sport that will continue beyond 2020.
